Our excellent and long-standing domestic violence programs and Encore Plus carry out our mission. We plan to strengthen all activities of the YWCA in 2009.

Taking back control of our entire site has proven to be a tremendous success. We still have a number of hurdles before us, before we can restore the facility to its former glory. We are starting a Capital campaign to revamp the pool facilities, the gym, and our kitchen. Once done the services that we will be able to offer the community will be awesome. We are happy to share that one of the Friends of the YWCA has been generous enough to match the grant we received from the Glendale Community Foundation. This will allow us to start the gym renovations necessary to let community groups use the gym for basketball, volleyball and other events. The YWCA received a grant from the Ludwick Foundation. This will allow us to complete the renovation of the emergency shelter. Our TECH GYRLS program has recently received sponsorship from Citigroup/Smith-Barney, and we are preparing to move forward with its introductory implementation

## **YWCA of Glendale Success Stories**

♥ Beatings, forced estrangement from her children, and physical and psychological domination are all sadly typical of domestic violence. At 33, "Mary" (not her real name) had been in this type of abusive relationship for about 10 years. After a minor heart attack in 2002, her working abilities became limited and she had lost everything she used to have: her house, furniture, clothes, and car. When she first came to The YWCA of Glendale, she was depressed and angry about the things that happened to her. We provided her with a therapeutic environment in which to process her trauma. Mary started to participate in counseling services and after six months her anxiety decreased. She recovered her self esteem and learned to depend on herself. Domestic Violence service at the Glendale YWCA has assisted her in understanding the link between trauma and the general cycle of abuse, substance abuse, violence and dependency. Today Mary is a successful student at college majoring in nursing, an excellent employee, and a strong and caring mother who has a positive outlook in her relationships with loved ones and friends.

♥ A family of three came to the shelter to get away from their abuser. The family had fear in their eyes. Their emotional spirit was destroyed by the abuser. A few weeks later a generous donor gave the shelter tickets to a Live Sesame Street Show. The Shelter coordinator assisted the family with transportation and went along with the family for support. The children ages six and nine had never been to a live show and didn't even know what a Sesame Street show was. The family was so excited and smiled and laughed throughout the day. The Mom said the abuser controlled all of the finances and she had never been able or allowed to take her children to an event. That day was a memorable experience that the family will never forget.

The small things that we all take for granted can make a huge difference in the lives of our clients. We enrich our own lives when we help these women and children who have so little.

**ENCORE plus** screened 5,432 women for Mammograms, and 8,125 Clinical Breast Exams, and 6,652 women for pap smears in 2008. One out of eight women will be diagnosed with breast cancer.... Each woman has a name, a last name, and a face; the only thing that these women are deprived of is insurance... our nation is aware of the fall in our economy. On our day-to-day basis we discuss inflation and the impact our economy has on our every day life. What the media does not highlight is the impact our economy has on helpless women who are losing their jobs every day; these women are the sole providers in their families. Women are struggling to put food on the table, so the last priority in their life is their own health. 62% of women are uninsured. What most women don't realize is that if they aren't healthy or even alive they can't provide for their families. ENCORE plus is a program that provides free mammograms and Pap smears to uninsured and medically underserved women. The cost for an average Mammogram and Clinical Breast Exam is \$120.00. For most of us that is a small price to pay to save our life, but for some of our clients that is a whole weeks worth of pay... For those of us that are blessed to be insured *get screened!!* Remember all the women that don't have a choice in getting screened.
